THE DOOLITTLES MISSIONARIES IN BRAZIL

JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2024

In 1995 I surrendered to missions. God opened the door for Kelly to teach in a school for missionary children in Manaus, Brazil. We guit our jobs, sold everything we had, and with very little support headed to Manaus in September 1995. We stayed in Manaus for almost one year. During this time Kelly taught at the school for missionary children, and we also took over another missionary's church plant. It was a time when we were also able to get our permanent paperwork together to stay in Brazil. We returned to the US to raise more support and have our first child, Philip. We joined Macedonia World Baptist Missions and hit the deputation trail. In March 1999 we returned to Brazil. We had two small children at the time, Philip and Hannah. We went to the city of Várzea Grande which is where my dad had a camp. We stayed about a year here while Kelly studied the Portuguese language. We then moved to Brasiléia, Acre. Here we had our first church plant. From this church plant we not only worked the city but the interior as well with Bible studies and preaching points. We were also able to help start a church plant in Cobija, Bolivia, which was across the river, and a church plant in the interior community of Guajará. We then moved to the capital city of Acre, Rio Branco. Here we were able to start another church plant and assist a national missionary in another work. These works that God allowed us to start are all still going on for His honor and glory. We then moved back to Várzea Grande to assist in the camp ministry that my dad had started. We were there for one year and then moved to Guarantã do Norte, where we are today. God has done a tremendous work, and we are thankful to have been used by Him. We are also thankful for each church and individual that has partnered with us all these years. We are also very grateful for Macedonia World Baptist Missions and the invaluable support they have given us. Words cannot express our gratitude. Only in heaven will you know the impact that you had on the lives of the people here.

On May 14, 2024, we will be coming off the mission field. I will be resigning from Macedonia World Baptist Missions. I had made a commitment to God that I would stay on the field receiving financial support from churches and individuals if I was able to give HIM 100%. Well, I am not able to do that anymore, and I cannot justify my commitment to God by receiving financial support from you and not being able to continue 100%. God has sent a second-generation missionary to Brazil, Bro. Scott Allen, to carry this work forward. He is also a MWBM missionary. We are at present going through the transition process of finalizing what we need to do here before returning.
